As our foundation enters its eighth year supporting the community of Bridgeport, we have now distributed over \$45,000 to Bridgeport high school students who are college bound! In 2015, we donated \$6,000 for scholarships and we again sponsored what is now an annual Western BBQ and Concert as a fundraising event for the Bridge-

port Fish Enhancement Foundation. As you know better than most, we were able to donate another \$4,000 to the BFEF in 2015, increasing our financial support for this important local organization to \$25,000 in total! They will again be one of the recipients of net proceeds from our 7<sup>th</sup> An-

nual Western BBQ and Concert already scheduled for September 3rd, 2016!

And it's important to note we would not be nearly as successful without the commitment and fund raising of partner fishing group—FISH-O-RAMA!
